2010 Competitive Grants

African American Cultural Center: \$18,000 to support a theatre arts program which will assist in increasing academic achievement, enhance cultural awareness, while lessening risky behaviors.

Albright-Knox Art Gallery: \$10,000 toward repair and restoration of the 1905 exterior marble and granite staircase located on the east side of the building facing Delaware Park and Hoyt Lake.

BISSNET: \$12,500 to support the overall annual program costs of the Diversity and Community Engagement Program.

Buffalo Arts Studio: \$15,000 to support youth arts education through the Jump Start and Mentorship programs.

Buffalo Hearing and Speech Center: \$10,750 to support transportation scholarships for 30 students who would otherwise not be able to attend the Language to Literacy Program.

Buffalo Niagara Riverkeeper: \$12,500 to fund canoes and kayaks, associated equipment, storage, and safety supplies and training for the Buffalo Niagara River Tour program.

Child and Adolescent Treatment Services: \$27,631 to continue and strengthen services for youth who are leaving the Erie County Foster Care System.

Cradle Beach: \$28,028 for a pilot academic achievement program and cover the expenses of seven overnight weekend retreats for 60 children from Buffalo Public School #43.

Daemen College: \$29,042 to provide Regents exam preparation assistance and mentoring for 80 refugee youth through an after-school program.

Equi-Star: \$3,000 to provide Girl and Boy Scouts the opportunity to assist and interact with individuals with disabilities and emotionally challenged youth in a therapeutic horseback riding summer camp.

Friends of Reinstein Nature Preserve: \$8,500 to support an Invasive Species Coordinator and combat invasive species at Reinstein Woods.

Harvest House of South Buffalo: \$90,000 in support of the New Hope Education Center expansion which will increase the current building from 5,000 square feet to 17,000 square feet and, in turn, provide more services for the underserved citizens on the East Side of Buffalo.

Joan A. Male Family Support Center: \$30,825 to fund nine months of a 12 month bus lease to transport 22-25 additional children to and from the daycare center.

Just Buffalo Literary Center: \$20,000 to support Reclaiming Buffalo, a community based after-school program that will create a panorama of the City reflecting the hopes and goals of its youth through words and photographic images. The program will be implemented in conjunction with CEPA Gallery.

Locust Street Neighborhood Art Classes: \$15,000 to support the children's program in visual arts.

Martin House Restoration Corporation: \$10,000 to support interior restoration of the Darwin Martin House.

Massachusetts Avenue Project: \$30,000 to support the youth employment and the enterprise development components of the Growing Green Program.

NativityMiguel Middle School: \$6,000 to increase the capacity of the graduate support program.

Niagara University: \$27,374 to build individual and community civic empowerment capacity by establishing a sustainable resident leadership base, to reduce the City of Niagara Falls' existing demographic disparities, through training and the implementation of environmental revitalization projects.

Richardson Center Corporation: \$10,000 to enable work to continue on the stabilization and reuse of the historic Richardson Olmsted Complex and prepare for public access during the 2011 National Trust Preservation Conference and beyond.

SPCA of Erie County: \$7,800 to fund the direct program costs of the conservation, medical assistance, stewardship, and education of and about Western New York wildlife.

United Way of Buffalo and Erie County: \$20,000 to support the Economic Empowerment Program.
